

Beyoncé's 'Spirit' video for 'The Lion King' includes 11 outfit changes

"The Lion King" doesn't hit theaters until
Thursday, but Beyoncé has already blessed fans
with new music and an accompanying video that
captures the grandeur of the film.

On Tuesday night, the 37-year-old singer, who voices Nala in the Disney movie, released the visuals for "Spirit," the first single off of a compilation album she produced to complement the movie's soundtrack, "The Lion King: The Gift."

Filmed at Havasu Falls in the Grand Canyon and styled by Zerina Akers, the video features over-the-top custom and couture fashions sourced from designers around the world and showcased against stunning natural vistas.

In total, Beyoncé herself has nearly a dozen outfit changes, while her dancers coordinate in

complementary looks of their own. There's even a special pink gown for Blue Ivy, who matches her mom with a voluminous, curly mane of red hair.

"The concept of the video is to show how God is the painter and natural beauty and nature needs no art direction," Beyoncé told Roberts. "It's the beauty of color, the beauty of melanin the beauty of tradition."



An epic pearl bustier with cowrie shell harness and face mask is made even more impactful by the stark scenery.

Notable looks include a tailored suit and matching bustier (\$300) by Dakar-based Tongoro Studio, which Beyoncé paired with the brand's gold face jewelry (\$112) and durag, and a red and pink voluminous coat from Valentino's spring 2019 couture show – which Italian designer Pierpaolo Piccioli created in tribute to iconic black women like Beverly Johnson — layered over a latex dress by Venus Prototype.

Quick changes include a fringed Hyun Mi Nielsen coat, a red fringe look from Déviant La Vie and a stunning custom pearl bustier from Brazilian brand Maison Alexandre with a cowrie-shell-and-chain harness by Laurel DeWitt.
